

## **Residential Permit Parking:**

### **What is residential permit parking?**

Residential permit parking restricts parking on defined streets to residents. Cars would need to display a parking permit to legally park on the street during designated enforcement hours. These hours of enforcement would likely be 8 am to 5 pm; Monday - Friday. Any visitor or service provider that needs parking on the street during the enforcement hours would need a visitor's parking permit.

### **Do I have to buy a residential parking permit?**

If you do not park on the street during the enforcement hours of permit parking, you do not have to buy a parking permit. Designated hours will likely be weekdays from 8 am to 5 pm., although enforcement hours can be adjusted depending on the needs of the residential permit parking zone.

### **What is the cost of a permit?**

Residential permits are \$15 for 6 months. Guest permits are \$2.00 for 24 hours. Guest permits are available to purchase in bulk (20).

### **How can my block get residential permit parking established?**

- To qualify for permit parking, 75% of the available parking spots on your block need to be taken up by non-residents.
- A minimum of three contiguous blocks are needed to establish a residential permit parking zone.
- 60% of the households (every legal address) needs to sign a petition supporting resident permit parking.
- You need to volunteer or find volunteers on your block to take petitions door to door.
- If the above 4 situations are met, the Heritage Hill Association will petition the City to begin its investigation in establishing a permit parking zone. Further surveying will be done by City staff to insure that the intent of the permit parking ordinance is met.

*Residential permit parking does not guarantee you a parking spot in front of your house. The permit allows residents to park in the residential parking zone.*
